

# Assessing the MYP Personal Project: Five changes for 2022

Highlighted below are the changes in the requirements for the MYP Personal Project, effective from the May 2022 assessment session. These five changes are designed to make the process simpler and allows for increased student agency

<b>Old assessment</b> Unchanged for the May/November 2021 examination sessions	<b>New assessment</b> Introduced for the May 2022 examination session and onwards
1 Included with Community Project in the MYP Projects Guide	1 Dedicated MYP Personal Project Guide
2 Students set a 'highly challenging' goal for a product / outcome	2 Students set an overall goal consisting of two interrelated parts – a product/outcome goal and a learning goal
3 Goal must be linked to a global context	3 Student MAY link their goal to a global context, but this is no longer a requirement
4 Specific ATL skills to be demonstrated at each stage of the process	4 Student selects the most appropriate ATL skills for each stage of the project
5 4 assessment criteria; project marked out of 32	5 3 assessment criteria, more closely linked to the inquiry cycle; project marked out of 24
